In line with that, in this paper we aim to explore some aspects of sustainability citizenship of future teachers as well as their preparedness for implementation of education for sustainability. The interest in studying the cultural identity of future preschool and primary school teachers arises from the need to nurture and educate the new generations of young people in the former Yugoslav republics in line with the values of sustainable peace and constructive handling of conflict situations. The aim of the paper is to establish a manner in which the future preschool and school teachers from Croatia, Serbia and Bosnia and Herzegovina handle conflict situations. The research sample is appropriate and includes university students of all academic levels within the teacher education faculties' courses for preschool and primary school teachers, from the following three countries: Croatia - Rijeka (N=267), Serbia - Belgrade (N=240) and Bosnia and Herzegovina -Zenica (N=199). The research participants filled in a questionnaire in which they provided answers, from never to always on the Likerttype scale, to 32 possible ways of handling one of their recent conflicts with a specific person from their living environment. The four dimensions of behaviour in conflict situations were extracted by
